  - A. Update on Groundwater Conditions in Yucaipa Subbasin for the 2021-2022 Water Year

Steve Stuart provided an overview of the current groundwater conditions for Water Year 2022 which is considered dry with only 8.48 inches of precipitation of an annual mean rainfall of 15.64 inches.

The North Bench Management Area has a Sustainable Yield Pumping Allocation of 3,940 acre feet per year compared to a 2022 Water Year production of 5,683 acre feet.

The Calimesa Management Area has a Sustainable Yield Pumping Allocation of 4,955 acre feet per year compared to a 2022 Water Year production of 4,390 acre feet.

The Western Heights Management Area has a Sustainable Yield Pumping Allocation of 1,760 acre feet per year compared to a 2022 Water Year production of 1,382 acre feet.

The suggestion during the presentation was to have the \$95,080 financial contribution of the total \$380,319 project cost be divided with each water purveyor paying 18.75% and each regional partner paying 6.25% of the cost.

## RE: Introduction to the Yucaipa Sustainable Groundwater Management Agency

Dear Private Well Owner:

The Yucaipa Sustainable Groundwater Management Agency (Yucaipa SGMA) is a consortium of local water purveyors, municipalities, and regional water districts that formed a Groundwater Sustainability Agency (GSA) in 2017 in accordance with the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA). One of the purposes of the GSA was to prepare a Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP) for the Yucaipa Subbasin. The GSP details how the Yucaipa SGMA will oversee the sustainable management of the groundwater resource in the Yucaipa Subbasin.

- What is Groundwater Sustainability? Sustainable groundwater management is the use of groundwater that can be maintained without causing undesirable results, such as a chronic lowering of groundwater levels, significant loss of groundwater in storage, degradation of water quality, land subsidence, or a depletion of interconnected surface water.
- Who is the Yucaipa Sustainable Groundwater Management Agency? The Yucaipa SGMA includes South Mesa Water Company, South Mountain Water Company, Western Heights Water Company, Yucaipa Valley Water District, the City of Redlands, the City of Yucaipa, San Bernardino Valley Municipal Water District and San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency.
- What is the Yucaipa Subbasin Groundwater Sustainability Plan? The Yucaipa Subbasin GSP was adopted by the Yucaipa SGMA in 2022. The GSP establishes the framework for sustainably managing and preserving the beneficial uses of our local groundwater resource today and into the future.
- Why Are We Reaching Out To You? As someone who produces groundwater for beneficial use, you may serve an integral part in managing our groundwater resource sustainably. To do so, we are asking for information about your well or wells, how much water you produce, and what your water quality is like. This information will help the Yucaipa SGMA understand groundwater conditions in the basin, and to ensure that you and other groundwater users like you continue to benefit from this precious resource for years to come.

## Subject: SGMA Round 2 Draft Award Comment Letter

To Whom It May Concern:

San Bernardino Valley Municipal Water District (Valley District), on behalf of the Yucaipa Sustainable Groundwater Management Agency, applied for a SGMA Round 2 grant for projects to improve the sustainability of the Yucaipa Subbasin (DWR Basin No. 8-002.07).

We understand the tremendous level of effort needed to review grants and appreciate DWR's efforts. From our review of the draft funding recommendations, it appears funding has almost strictly been limited to applications that served Severely Disadvantaged Communities and Underrepresented Communities with the bulk of the funding going to northern California Central Valley basins.

With this letter we would ask that should funding become available that consideration be given to *more funding in Southern California*. We would also like to highlight benefits of the projects included in the Yucaipa GSA application:

<u>Component 2: County Line Recharge Basin and Turnout Project (CLR & TO)</u>. This would be a joint project between three member agencies of the GSA. The project will facilitate groundwater recharge and recovery of 1,470 acre feet a year (AFY) of State Water Project water in the Calimesa Management Area of the Yucaipa Subbasin. The water made available will provide water for neighboring cities and disadvantaged communities, including the cities of Calimesa and Yucaipa, but *the primary beneficiary is the severely disadvantaged community* served by a local water purveyor, South Mesa Water Company. Without the ability to access this supplemental supply, agencies of the Yucaipa SGMA, do not have infrastructure available to store water and provide reliable source of water during drought emergencies, leaving these communities vulnerable to drought restrictions and the groundwater basin at risk of future groundwater level declines as climate change progresses. For the afore mentioned reasons, the Yucaipa GSA was deemed the priority project for the Yucaipa GSA. What's more, *the CLR & TO Project is ready to proceed to construction once funding is made available, and would be a 100% completed project with the awarded grant funding.* In addition, the CLR & TO Project comprises only a \$5,219,186 request (26%) compared to our total submittal.

<u>Component 3. Salinity and Groundwater Enhancement Project</u>. This project is an upgrade to a regional water reclamation facility needed to recharge up to 5,040 AFY to the Yucaipa Subbasin. This project will treat and reuse wastewater for multiple beneficial uses to meet existing and future needs within the Yucaipa area through groundwater replenishment. In

addition, increasing the use of recycled water for groundwater replenishment will decrease the reliance on imported water and continue efforts towards resolving regional water supply challenges.

We appreciate your consideration of this comment letter and ask that DWR work with the agencies of the Yucaipa GSA to find project funding. The Yucaipa GSA is seeking funding for both Component 2 and Component 3, however, the team understands that funding is limited, and project scarcity is not an issue. With this understanding and seeing how DWR disbursed the draft funding awards we are asking DWR to consider only funding Component 2 for the Yucaipa GSA. The Component 3 project is important, but the Component 2 project is 100% funded with the grant, in a SDAC service area, leverages using South Mesa Water Company's State Water Resources Control Board grant by reusing their pipeline and was deemed as the priority project for the Yucaipa GSP. Valley District, on behalf of the Yucaipa GSA, would be willing to work with DWR to find funding for the projects needed to further sustainable management of the Yucaipa Basin.
